The Sisters of St. Mary of Oregon began right here in Sublimity in 1887. Here is their story in two books. Most of the founding sisters were from Jordan or Sublimity. You will see a couple of new pictures in the photo album here. One is of Sr. Ruth Etzel vigorously ringing the angelus bell. This bell was given to the sisters by Bruno and Maria Boedigheimer, whose daughter was Sr. Cecelia, one of the founders, and whose granddaughter is our own town historian Vera Boedigheimer. The other picture is of Sr. Fidelis Kreutzer, the archivist at Beaverton, who has been very helpful to us.
